Regional Offices

Summary of Services

Maternity and Adoption Services

provide counseling for the pregnant women, birth fathers, and their families to assist in planning for themselves and their babies. Services include arranging for prenatal care and delivery and providing temporary care of infants in licensed homes for a short period of time while a permanent plan is made for the child. If adoption is the plan of choice by both parents, they are encouraged to actively participate in the selection of an adoptive family.

Independent Living Program

provides youth under the guardianship of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, ages 18 to 20, with intense case management services and placement into their own apartments with the goal of developing skills so they can successfully transition to independence upon emancipation at age 21.

Lake County Youth Mentorship Program

pairs youth ages 9-12 from Waukegan with volunteer mentors, who can serve as positive role models, encourage good decision-making and be a friend during times of need.

Emergency Assistance

provides emergency food, shelter, rental and utility assistance and crisis management services. Emergency food services help clients in order to meet short term nutritional needs. Shelter services include emergency shelter for homeless women, children and persons with disabilities as well as financial assistance to prevent homelessness. Other services that help a client stabilize include pharmaceutical assistance, transportation assistance, clothing vouchers and case management services.

Family Self-Sufficiency Program

assists low-income, single parents with dependent children, who are at least 18 years old, have stable housing, and are living a sober life, with education, training, employment assistance and case management services, for up to five years as they learn to achieve independence. Services are available in English and Spanish.

Rapid Re-Housing Program

assists recently homeless individuals and families to quickly locate permanent housing.

HIV/AIDS Case Management

provides comprehensive HIV/AIDS case management, mental health counseling, supportive and substance use disorder services, transportation, and food pantry services, to those living with HIV/AIDS in Lake County.

Immigration and Naturalization Services

is an accredited program that assists with the lawful permanent residency and naturalization processes. Staff can provide legal information and assist with the completion of forms. This program also provides educational and informational community presentations.

Supportive Services for Veteran Families

provides veterans experiencing homelessness, or imminent homelessness, with emergency housing and homeless prevention, intensive case management services, and connections to benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Veterans Employment Program

assists veterans in finding and maintaining employment by providing job readiness training, resume writing assistance, mock interviews, and job placement counseling.

Housing Advocacy Program,

in collaboration with the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, serves families in Lake County referred by DCFS whose housing needs are vital for family preservation.

Critical Time Intervention-Representative Payee (CTI-RP) Program

provides intensive housing case management services to the chronically homeless population with documented disabilities.

The Assets for Independence Program (AFI)

is a matched savings account program designed to assist those of modest means establish a pattern of regular savings and ultimately, purchase a productive asset. Savings and match money may be used toward the purchase of a home, to start a small business, or further education or job training.

provides health, recreational, educational, social, and nutritional programs, as well as a hot meal at noon for seniors who come to the drop-in center.

Samaritan Hope

is a scattered site apartment permanent housing program with supportive services for families to obtain stable housing and become self-sufficient. Families facing homelessness receive help locating an apartment, a gradually decreasing rental subsidy and wrap-around supportive services such as case management, counseling, budgeting, employment, housing stabilization and self-sufficiency services.

Holbrook Counseling Center

provides professional counseling services for adult individuals, couples and families, with emotional, behavioral and relationship or family problems, and marital or premarital problems. Counseling in Spanish is available. Services are available in Mundelein.

Loving Outreach to Survivors of Suicide (LOSS) Program

provides services for those who are grieving a death by suicide of a family member or close friend. LOSS offers weekly groups for the newly bereaved in 10 sessions. Group, individual and family counseling is also available. The LOSS Program offers monthly support group meetings at Carmel High School in Mundelein on the 4th Thursday of each month. The LOSS Program for Children and Youth addresses the unique needs of children and adolescents, ages three to 18, impacted by suicide of a family member or person close to them.

provides comprehensive services so that seniors are able to live independently or with caregivers in their own homes and communities. We offer a wide variety of programs and services for older adults and their family members. Coordinators provide information, assessments and connect clients to services such as, homemaker, adult day care, emergency home response, caregiver assistance, and transportation, Meals on Wheels, self-neglect cases, money management and benefits assistance. Community Outreach presentations about our programs and services are also available.

provide hot, tasty noon-time meals prepared and served once daily Monday thru Friday, in a Senior Center or restaurant for older adults who are physically able to come to a specific site.

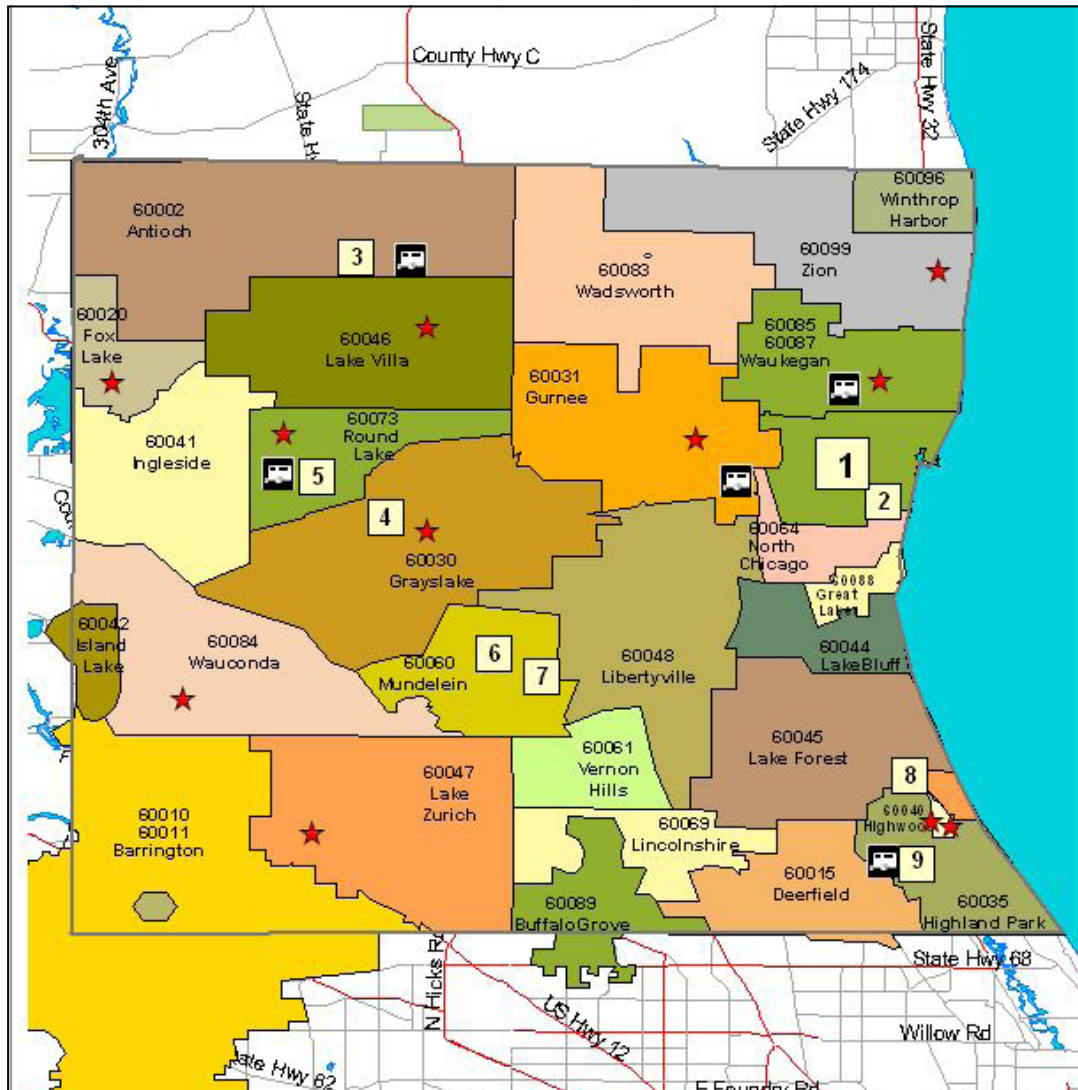
