Regional Offices

Regional offices function as local hubs where community residents can access Catholic Charities services. Regional Advisory Boards, made up of regional residents, guide and support the operations of the regional offices. We invite parishes, schools, and other community groups to volunteer and donate to the office. Pregnancy/Parenting and Adoption Support

Catholic Charities offers hope and respect with a full range of pregnancy services to teen or young women experiencing an unplanned or challenging pregnancy. Pregnancy and parenting support services are available to expectant mothers and fathers, and their families, of any age, race, religion, marital status, or economic background. This help is available throughout the pregnancy, and the infant's first year.

Independent Living Program

Provides youth under the guardianship of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, ages 18 - 21, with intense case management services and placement into their own apartments with the goal of developing skills so they can successfully transition to independence upon emancipation at age 21. **For more information, call (847) 782-4223**

Lake County Youth Mentorship Program

Pairs youth ages 9-12 with volunteer mentors, who can serve as positive role models, encourage good decision-making and be a friend during times of need.

Emergency Assistance

Provides emergency food, shelter, rental, and utility assistance and crisis management services. Emergency food services help clients to meet short term nutritional needs. Shelter services include emergency shelter for homeless women, children, and persons with medical needs that cannot be met by local shelters. Homeless prevention services include security deposit, rental and mortgage assistance to prevent homelessness. Other services that help a client stabilize include pharmaceutical assistance, transportation assistance, clothing vouchers, and case management services.

Family Self-Sufficiency Program

Assists low-income, single parents with dependent children, with education, training, employment assistance, and case management services, for up to five years as they learn to achieve independence. Services are available in English and Spanish. **For more information, call (847) 782-4145.**

HIV/AIDS Case Management

Provides comprehensive HIV/AIDS case management, mental health counseling, supportive and substance use disorder services, transportation, and food pantry services, to those living with HIV/AIDS in Lake County.

Housing Advocacy

In collaboration with the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, serves families in Lake County referred by DCFS whose housing needs are vital for family preservation.

Rapid Re-Housing Program

Assists recently homeless individuals and families to quickly locate permanent housing. **For more information, call (847) 782-4151.**

Immigration and Naturalization Services

It is a Department of Justice (DOJ) Recognized program that offers a wide spectrum of affordable, high-quality immigration legal services, including family/relative petitions, naturalization, petitions for victims of domestic violence and other qualifying crimes, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), replacement/renewal of permanent residence cards, outreach/education, and more. All services are provided by a DOJ Accredited immigration specialist, who guides immigrants in an ever-changing and complex immigration system.

Supportive Services for Veteran Families

Provides veterans experiencing homelessness, or imminent risk of homelessness, with emergency housing and homeless prevention, intensive case management services, and connections to benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Veterans Employment Program

Assists veterans and their families in finding and maintaining employment by providing job readiness training, resume writing assistance, mock interviews, and job placement counseling.

Critical Time Intervention-Representative Payee (CTI-RP) Program

Provides intensive housing case management services to the chronically homeless population with documented disabilities.

Samaritan Hope

A scattered site apartment permanent housing program with supportive services for families to obtain stable housing and become self-sufficient. Families facing homelessness receive help locating an apartment, a gradually decreasing rental subsidy and wrap-around supportive services such as case management, counseling, budgeting, employment, housing stabilization and self-sufficiency services.

Loving Outreach to Survivors of Suicide (LOSS) Program

LOSS provides services for those who are grieving the loss of a family member or other loved one by suicide. The LOSS Program offers weekly groups for the newly bereaved, monthly drop in groups, as well as individual and family counseling. LOSS offers an open drop-in group at Carmel High School in Mundelein on the 4th Thursday of every month. The LOSS Program for Children and Youth addresses the unique needs of children and adolescents impacted by the suicide of a family member or other loved one

Senior Case Management Services

Provides comprehensive services so that seniors are able to live independently or with caregivers in their own homes and communities. We offer a wide variety of programs and services for older adults and their family members. Coordinators provide information, assessments and connect clients to services such as, homemaker, adult day care, emergency home response, transportation, Meals on Wheels, and benefits assistance. The Community Center

Through an array of family activities, classes, and programs, The Community Center works to reduce isolation, support families, and build community. Staff helps families cope with challenges that may include unemployment, poor health, learning English, boosting literacy, and managing limited finances. Families who come to The Community Center emerge stronger, and in turn help to strengthen their community. Services offered include promoting wellness, ESL classes, computer classes, tax preparation, citizenship classes, legal assistance, and immigration services. Additional workshops, classes, and activities are provided throughout the year based upon participant interest and program resources.

Dining Programs for Adults 60+

Catholic Charities, offers nutritious hot meals and camaraderie for adults, age 60+ and their spouse of any age at various sites listed around Lake County. Qualified participants can dine around Lake County 5 to 6 days a week depending on the site. Suggested donations are usually around \$5.00 per meal. Youth and Family Therapeutic Services provides trauma-informed and strengths-based, in-house, and telehealth counseling to children and families in Cook and Lake counties. Services are offered in English and Spanish. Our Master's level clinicians provide services that address: Parenting, Anxiety, Depression, Attention Deficit Disorder, Trauma, Grief, Sexuality, Relationship issues, Stress Management, Suicide Prevention, Sexually Problematic Behaviors, Life transitions, School Problems, Immigration, DCFS involvement, Social Skills and more. We accept most forms of insurance and offer sliding scale fee options.

Child Parent Psychotherapy Program

Child Parent Psychotherapy is a FREE evidence-based program for parents and their children ages birth to five. Services help youth and families recover and heal after stressful and traumatic events. Services are designed to improve stress responses after traumatic events, strengthen family relationships, and reduce problem behaviors. This program is free to intact families, parenting youth in care, and recently reunified and adoptive parents. Lake County residents are eligible for services. Services are available in both English and Spanish. Telehealth Services are available.

Triple P Parenting Program


Provides FREE parenting skills to intact families, parenting youth in care, recently reunified, and adoptive parents. The program is a 10-12 session program that helps parents with youth between the ages of 0-12. Parents will learn how to ensure a safe and engaging environment, arrange a positive learning environment, use assertive discipline, establish realistic expectations, and take care of oneself as a parent. Services are available in English and Spanish. Services are provided in both Cook and Lake counties and telehealth is available.
